

## 7. CUSTOMS REGULATION AND PROCEDURES

The Customs authorities perform custom inspections after baggage claim on passengers arriving on international flights. #### 8. VISA REQUIREMENTS AND NATIONALITIES

All travelers to Indonesia must be a valid passport at least six months from date of arrival and have proved ticket of onward or return passage.

## "Visa Free"

Some Countries and territories are eligible for a "Visa Free" facility to enter Indonesia. Those holding valid passports from the following member states will be granted a non-extendable 30-day Visa-Free Short Visit Permit upon arrival at an Indonesian international gateway without any charge: Brunei Darussalam, Malaysia, and Morocco

## Visa on Arrival (VoA)

Visa on Arrival (VoA) facility is issued on arrival at Soekarno-Hatta International Airport, Jakarta or at Ngurah Rai International Airport, Bali, for visits not exceeding 30 days for nationals as follows: Algeria, Bahrain, United Arab Emirates, Iran, Kuwait, Libya, Maldives, Egypt, Oman, Qatar, Saudi Arabia, Suriname, Tunisia, and Turkey. The Visa on Arrival fee is US\$25; this visa is not extendable and not convertible into other types of visas. Should the bearer of diplomatic and service passport wishes to apply for VoA the above mentioned fee shall apply.

## **10. USEFUL INFORMATION**

## A. Banking Services/Currency and Exchange Rate

Banks are opened on Monday through Friday from 08.30 - 14.30 hours. However, foreign currencies exchanges can be found in all major shopping areas and hotels. Many shops and restaurants also accept credit cards.

#### **B.** Mobile Phone Service

For local calls within the same area or city, you may dial the telephone number by itself. For other areas or cities, you may dial the 'area code' before the telephone number. The area code should also be dialed when using a mobile phone. For international calls, dial the international dialing code (001, or 007), country code, area code, and the individual number.

The network for Cellular phone in Indonesia is GSM and CDMA. If you bring your own cellular mobile phone, you can purchase prepaid calling cards/SIM card to make outgoing calls at lower cost than calling using your home SIM card. Shops which sell these cards are available. Major service providers are: Telkomsel, Satelindo and XL Ritel.

## C. Climate

Jakarta has a tropical climate appropriate to its proximity to the equator. Year round temperatures averaging 31 degrees Celsius.

#### D. Time Difference

The official time in Jakarta is seven hours ahead of Greenwich Mean Time (GMT+7).

## E. Electricity supply

The electricity supply most commonly used in Indonesia is the 220-volt 60 Hz system. Delegates who travel with electric appliances are advice to check their electronic equipment beforehand and to carry a plug- adapter kit.
