ON
CANDIDACIES FOR INTERNATIONAL POSITIONS

The Thirty-fifth Session of the Council of Foreign Ministers (Session of Prosperity and Development), held in Kampala, Republic of Uganda from 14 – 16 Jumadal Thani 1429, (18 -20 June, 2008),

Aware of the importance of representation of States Members of the OIC in various international positions;

Having considered the candidacies presented by Member States in this regard;

Decides to support the following candidacies:

1. Candidacy of Dr Aziza Banani (Kingdom of Morocco) for the position of Director General of the United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization (UNESCO) during the elections that will be held in Paris in October 2009.
2. Candidacy of Dr Ismail Alhaj Musa (Republic of Sudan) for membership of the Executive Council of the United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization (UNESCO).
3. Candidacy of H.E. Mr Farouq Hosni, Minister of Culture of the (Arab Republic of Egypt), for the position of Director General of the United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization (UNESCO) after the expiration of the term of the current Director General.
4. Candidacy of the Great Socialist People's Libyan Arab Jamahiriya for presidency of the sixty-fourth session of the United Nations General Assembly which will be held in New York in 2009.
5. Candidacy of the Arab Republic of Egypt to occupy one of the two seats designated for Africa in the Board of Governors of the International Atomic Energy Agency for the period from 2008 – 2010, at the elections scheduled to take place during the fifty-second session of the IAEA General Conference in Vienna in September 2008.

6. Candidacy of the State of Kuwait for membership of the Council of Administration of the Universal Postal Union for the period 2008-2012, at the elections to be held during the 24th Session of the Universal Postal Union Conference in Geneva in the period from 23 July 2008 – 12 August 2008.
7. Candidacy of the Republic of Turkey for non-permanent membership of the United Nations Security Council for the period from 2009 – 2010, at the elections to be held during the sixty-third session of the United Nations General Assembly in New York in 2008.
8. Candidacy of H.E. Mr Awn Shawkat Al-Khasawneh (Hashemite Kingdom of Jordan, Vice president of the International Court of Justice, for reelection to the Court at the elections to be held during the sixty-third session of the United Nations General Assembly in 2008.
9. Candidacy of the Republic of Togo for non-permanent membership of the United Nations Security Council for the period 2010 – 2011 at the elections to be held in 2009, during the 64th ordinary session of the United Nations General Assembly.
10. Candidacy of the Republic of Lebanon for non-permanent membership of the United Nations Security Council for the period 2010-2011 at the elections to be held during the Sixty-fourth Session of the United Nations General Assembly in 2009.
11. Candidacy of the State of Qatar for membership of the Council of Administration of the Universal Postal Union for the period 2008-2012, at the elections to be held during the 24th Session of the Universal Postal Union Congress in Geneva in the period from 23 July 2008 to 12 August 2008.
12. Candidacy of the Arab Republic of Egypt for membership of the Council of Administration of the Universal Postal Union and for re-election to membership of the UPU Postal Operations Council, at the election scheduled to take place in Geneva from 23 July to 12 August 2008.
13. Candidacy of the Arab Republic of Egypt for non-permanent membership of the United Nations Security Council for the period 2016-2017 at the elections to be held in 2015 in the United Nations General Assembly.
14. Candidacy of the State of Qatar for membership of the Executive Council of the United Nations Development Programme – United Nations Population Fund for the period 2010 – 2012

20. Candidacy of the State of the United Arab Emirates for membership of Council of Administration and the Investment Bureau of the Universal Postal Union for the period from 2008 – 2012.
21. Candidacy of H.E. Ambassador Ahmad Fathallah (Arab Republic of Egypt) for membership of the Human Rights Committee of the International Covenant on Political and Civil Rights during the elections scheduled to be held at the Meeting of the States Parties to the International Covenant on Political and Civil Rights in New York in September 2008.
22. Candidacy of the Kingdom of Morocco for membership of the Operational Council of the Universal Postal Union for the period 2008 – 2012.

24. Candidacy of the Federal Republic of Nigeria for non-Permanent membership of the Security Council for the period 2010/2011, at the elections that will be held during the 64th Session of the UN General Assembly in 2009.
25. Candidacy of the Republic of Azerbaijan as part of the Eastern Europe Group for non-permanent membership of the United Nations Security Council, for the period of 2012-2013, at the elections to be held during the 66th Session of the United Nations General Assembly in New York, in 2011.

26. Candidacy of the Republic of Azerbaijan as part of the Eastern Europe Group for the United Nations Human Rights Council, for the period of 2009-2012, at the elections to be held during the 64th Session of the United Nations General Assembly in New York, in 2009.
27. Candidacy of the Republic of Azerbaijan as part of the Eastern Europe Group for the Presidency of the United Nations General Assembly, for 2032, at the elections to be held during the 87th Session of the United Nations General Assembly in New York, in 2032.
28. Candidacy of the Islamic Republic of Iran for the Postal Operation Council of Universal Postal Union (UPU) in the elections to be held in 2008.
29. Candidacy of the Islamic Republic of Iran to the governing body of International Labour Conference (ILO) in the elections to be held in 2008.
30. Candidacy of the Islamic Republic of Iran for non-permanent membership in the Security Council of the United Nations for the period 2009-2010.
31. Candidacy of the Republic of Kazakhstan to the UN Security Council as a Non-Permanent member for the period of 2011-2012 during the elections which will be held in October 2010 in New York.

36. Candidacy of His Excellency H.R. Agung Laksono, the Speaker of the House of Representatives of the Republic of Indonesia as the President of the Inter-Parliamentary Union (IPU) for the period 2008-2011, during the elections at the 119th IPU Assembly, which will take place in October, 2008 in Geneva, Switzerland.

Candidacy of the Republic of Tunisia (representing Africa) for membership of the Council of Administration and the Investment Council of the Universal Postal Union for the period 2008 – 2012, at the elections to be held during the 34th World Congress scheduled to take place in Geneva from 23 July – 12 August 2008.
40. Candidacy of the Islamic Republic of Mauritania for a non-permanent seat of the United Nations Security Council for the period 2012 – 2013.
41. Candidacy of Dr. Sima Samar (Islamic Republic of Afghanistan) for the position of High Commissioner for Human Rights.
42. Re-election of Burkina Faso to the Postal Operation Council of Universal Postal Union (UPU) for the period from 2009 – 2012.
43. Candidacy of Dr. Fadheela Al-Mahroos, (Kingdom of Bahrain), Member of the Supreme Council for Women and Chairperson of the Board of Directors of the Bahrain Centre for the Protection of Children, for membership of the Committee for the Elimination of All Forms of Discrimination against Women (CEDAW) for the period from 2009-2011, at the elections to be held on 30 July, 2008 in New York.
44. Candidacy of the Islamic Republic of Pakistan for membership of the United Nations Human Rights Council for the period 2008-2011 at the election to be held at General Assembly on 21 May 2008.
45. Candidacy of the Islamic Republic of Pakistan for membership of the Postal Operations Council of the Universal Postal Union, at the elections to be held during the 24th August 2008 at Geneva.

46. Candidacy of the Islamic Republic of Pakistan for Non-Permanent membership of the United Nations Security Council for the period 2011-2012, at the elections to be held during the United Nations General Assembly in 2010.
47. Candidacy of the Republic of Senegal for membership of the Council of Administration and Postal Operation Council of the Universal Postal Union for the period 2008-2012 at the elections to be held during the 24th Congress of the Universal Postal Union which will be held at Geneva in the period from 23 July to 15 August, 2008
48. Candidacy of the Syrian Arab Republic for membership of the Council of Administration and Bureau of Postal Investment of the Universal Postal Union for the period from 2008-2012 at the elections to be held during the 24th Congress of the Universal Postal Union in Geneva from 23 July – 12 August 2008.
49. Candidacy of the Syrian Arab Republic to occupy one of the Seats allocated for the Middle East and South Asia on the Board of Governors of the International Atomic Energy for the period from 2008-2010, at the elections to be held during the 52nd Session of the IAEA General Conference in Vienna in September 2008.
50. Candidacy of Ali Reza Dayham (Islamic Republic of Iran) for the position of the Secretary General of the Asia-African Consultative Body, at the elections to be held in 2008.
51. Candidacy of the Republic of Azerbaijan for membership of the Council of Administration and Postal Operation Council of the Universal Postal Union (UPU) at the elections to be held during the 24th Congress of the UPU in Geneva from 23 July – 12 August 2008.
52. Candidacy of Dr. Fahima Sharaf al-Deen (Republic of Lebanon) for membership of the Committee on the Elimination of Discrimination against Women (CEDAW) at the elections to be held during the 15th meeting of the States' parties to the UN Convention in New York on 30 July, 2008.
53. Candidacy of Dr. Boubacar Camara (Republic of Senegal) for the position of Secretary General of the World Customs Organisation at the elections to be held in Brussels in the period from 26-28 June 2008.

54. Candidacy of the Kingdom of Morocco for non-permanent membership in the United Nations Security Council for the period from 2012-2013.

Nomination of Mr. Mohamed Aiyat (Kingdom of Morocco) for the membership of the Human Rights Commission for the period 2009-2013 in the elections scheduled to take place alongside the meeting of the States Parties to the International Covenant on Civil and Political Rights, which will be held in New York on September 4, 2008.
56. Requests the Secretary General to follow up the implementation of this resolution and to submit a report thereon to the 36th Session of the Council of Foreign Ministers.

**RESOLUTION NO. 2/35-ORG
ON
HARMONIZATION OF THE WORK OF ORGANIZATIONS AND
INSTITUTIONS OF INTER-ISLAMIC COOPERATION**

The Council of Foreign Ministers in its thirty-fifth Session (Session of Prosperity and Development), held in Kampala, Republic of Uganda from 14th to 16th Jumad ul-Thani 1429H (18th to 20th June 2008),

Recalling and reiterating all the Council of Ministers resolutions;

Reaffirms that the Organization of the Islamic Conference (OIC) remains the primary framework for cooperation among its Member States in all fields, including political, economic, social, judicial, legal, cultural, scientific and technological and any other matters of interest to the Islamic Ummah;

Recalling that the Charter of the OIC stipulates that “the Islamic Summit shall deliberate, take policy decisions and provide guidance on all issues pertaining to the realization of the objectives as provided for in the Charter and consider other issues of concern to the Member States and the Ummah”;

Further recalling that the Council of Foreign Ministers may recommend convening other sectorial Ministerial meetings to deal with the specific issues of concern to the Ummah, and that such meetings shall submit their reports to the Islamic Summit and the Council of Foreign Ministers;

Further recalling that the Council of Foreign Ministers is mandated with establishing any new organ or committee of the OIC;

Recalling the many resolutions issued by the Council of Foreign Ministers pertaining to the rationalization of the work of the OIC, including resolution no.2/30-ORG of the Thirtieth Session of the Islamic Conference of Foreign Ministers, call for the enhancement of the Organization’s efficiency and effectiveness, and the avoiding of duplication and overlapping;

1. **Takes note** of the initiatives of some Member States to create new entities, pertaining to inter-Islamic cooperation, which are not related to OIC.
2. **Reiterates** that the OIC shall remain the primary framework for cooperation, collaboration and consultation among the Member States of the Organization.
3. **Affirms** the necessity that any new entities or organizations created for the purpose of cooperation between the OIC Member States should act within the framework of the OIC and should include a mechanism for cooperation and consultation with the OIC and its Secretariat to avoid duplication and overlapping in inter-Islamic cooperation.
